§2745 Prescriptions

F. Controlled Substances Listed in Schedule II

2. Expiration Date of Prescriptions

A prescription for a controlled substance listed in Schedule II shall expire ~~six months~~ ninety days after the date of issue. No pharmacist shall dispense any controlled substance pursuant to an expired prescription.

B. Prescriptions for Controlled Substances Listed in Schedule II

3. Expiration Date

A pharmacist shall not dispense a prescription for a controlled substance listed in Schedule II more than ~~six months~~ ninety days after the date of issue of the prescription.

7. Prescriptions for Opioid Derivatives Written by Practitioners Not Licensed by the State of Louisiana

a. When a prescription for an opioid derivative is written by a prescriber not licensed by the State of Louisiana, the pharmacist shall not dispense more than a ten day supply at a dosage not to exceed the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved labeling for that medication.

b. The dispensing pharmacist shall notify the prescriber of the supply dispensed and the cancellation of the remainder of the prescription.

c. No pharmacist may dispense that same medication to that same patient when prescribed by that same prescriber for a sixty day period following the dispensing of the initial prescription as described in Subparagraph B.7.a.
