- 9. Insert pages 263 through 264 in the binder, following the BULLETINS tab.
- 10. Insert pages 265 through 272 in the binder, following the MISC. tab.
- 11. Insert pages 273 through 274 in the binder, following the INDEX tab.

Summary of Updates to Louisiana Pharmacy Law Book

- Act 315 (SB 205) of the 2011 Legislature amended the Pharmacy Practice Act to allow those
 pharmacies in penal institutions owned and operated by the La. Dept. of Public Safety &
 Corrections to re-use previously dispensed and unused prescription drugs, similar to the authority
 currently held by hospital pharmacies [La. R.S. 37:1226.3]. The law requires the Board to
 promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of the new law; and that rulemaking effort is
 underway.
- Several bills in the 2011 Legislature amended the state's controlled substance laws in Title 40.
 - Act 420 (HB 12) reorganized and expanded the list of synthetic cannabinoids in Schedule I of the state's list of controlled substances, and further, added 'bath salts' to Schedule I [La. R.S. 40:964].
 - Act 155 (SB 223) amended the provision authorizing the prescribing of controlled substances to permit the electronic generation, signature, transmission, receipt, and processing of prescriptions for controlled substances in Schedules 2-5, but only in conformance with the DEA rules already in place [La. R.S. 40:978].
 - Act 100 (HB 339) amended the provisions relative to imitation or counterfeit controlled substances, adding language that 'possession with intent to distribute' such products is a violation of the controlled substances law. [La. R.S. 40:971.1].
- The Dept. of Health and Hospitals promulgated an emergency rule in May 2011 that placed certain chemicals known as 'bath salts' in Schedule I of the state's list of controlled substances [LAC 46:LIII.2704]. Since emergency rules are only effective for 120 days, the department also sponsored legislation [See Act 420 above] shortly thereafter that made the scheduling action permanent.
