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6	PHARMACISTS: Provides relative to administration of immunizations.

8	AN ACT
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10	To amend and reenact R.S. 37:1218, relative to administration of influenza immunization, and
11	R.S. 37:1218.1, relative to administration of immunizations and vaccines other than
12	influenza immunizations.
13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
14	Section 1. R.S. 37:1218 and R.S. 37:1218.1 are hereby amended and reenacted to read:
15	§1218. Administration of influenza immunization
16	A pharmacist, or pharmacy intern or certified pharmacy technician both of whom shall be
17	supervised by a pharmacist, may administer an influenza immunization to any person
18	seven three years of age or older without a prescription or medical order, contingent upon
19	all of the following provisions:
20	(1) The pharmacist, pharmacy intern and certified pharmacy technician shall
21	administer influenza immunizations in conformance with the most current annual
22	influenza vaccination protocol as set forth by the United States Centers for
23	Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Advisory Committee on Immunization
24	Practice (ACIP).

25	(2)	The pharmacist or his agent shall report each influenza immunization to the
26		Louisiana Office of Public Health Immunization Registry Department of Health,
27		office of public health's Louisiana Immunization Network for Kids Statewide at
28		the time of the immunization or as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter.
29	(3)	The pharmacist or his agent shall report all adverse events he observes or which
30		are reported to him to the Vaccines Adverse Events Reporting System (VAERS),
31		the cooperative program of the CDC and the United States Food and Drug
32		Administration for vaccine safety, or its successor program; and further, the
33		pharmacist shall refer the patient with an adverse event to the influenza
34		immunization for appropriate medical care.
35	(4)	The pharmacist or his agent shall maintain for at least two years a record of each
36		influenza immunization administered.
37	(5)	The pharmacist, pharmacy intern and certified pharmacy technician shall obtain
38		the appropriate credential to administer influenza immunizations from the board
39		education and training, as administratively defined, prior to administering any
40		such immunization; and further, shall retain evidence of their continuing
41		competency for such immunizations, as administratively defined by the board.
42	§1218.1 Adm	inistration of immunizations and vaccines other than influenza immunizations
43	A.	A pharmacist, or pharmacy intern or certified pharmacy technician both of whom
44		shall be supervised by a pharmacist, may administer to an individual age
45		seventeen three or older an immunization or a vaccine without a patient-specific
46		prescription or medical order if the immunization or vaccine is administered in
47		conformance with the most current immunization administration protocol as set

forth by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

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Advisory Committee on Immunization Practice. At the time that a pharmacist, pharmacy intern or certified pharmacy technician administers an immunization or vaccine under the provisions of this Section, the pharmacist, pharmacy intern or certified pharmacy technician shall also inform the individual that the administration of an immunization or vaccine under this Section is not to be construed as being in lieu of an annual checkup with the individual's primary care or family physician.

- (1) The pharmacist <u>or his agent</u> shall report each immunization to the Department of Health, office of public health's Louisiana Immunization Network for Kids Statewide at the time of the immunization or as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter, as this is the official state vaccination record.
- The pharmacist or his agent shall report all adverse events he observes or which are reported to him to the Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting

 System, the cooperative program of the United States Centers for Disease

 Control and Prevention (CDC) and the United States Food and Drug

 Administration for vaccine safety, or its successor program; and further, the pharmacist shall refer the patient with an adverse event to an immunization for appropriate medical care.
- (3) The pharmacist or his agent shall maintain for at least two years a record of each immunization administered.
- (4) The pharmacist, pharmacy intern and certified pharmacy technician shall obtain the appropriate eredential to administer immunizations from the board education and training, as administratively defined, prior to

73		administering any such immunization; and further, shall retain evidence of
74		their continuing competency for such immunizations, as administratively
75		defined by the board.
76		(5) The pharmacist <u>or his agent</u> shall request the name of a patient's primary
77		care provider prior to the administering of any immunization. If the
78		patient identifies such primary care provider to the pharmacist or his
79		agent, the pharmacist or his agent shall notify the primary care provider,
80		by written or electronic communication, as soon as reasonably possible
81		thereafter that the immunization was administered.
