20	B. Pati	ent Authority to Acquire Prescription Drug	
21	<u>1.</u>	A prescription or chart order represents the lawful authority for a person to acquire a prescription drug	
22		from a pharmacy licensed to dispense prescription drugs.	
23	<u>2.</u>	In the absence of refill instructions on the original prescription, the prescription shall not be refilled.	
24		A pharmacy may dispense the total quantity authorized in one transaction, or in the alternative, may	
25		dispense partial quantities in multiple transactions, provided however that the sum of the partial quantities	
26		shall not exceed the total quantity authorized.	
27	3.	In the event a prescription contains refill instructions, the prescription may be refilled when requested by	
28		the person or caregiver. A pharmacy may dispense the quantity authorized for each refill in a single	
29		transaction, or in the alternative, may dispense partial quantities in multiple transactions, provided	
30		however that the sum of the partial quantities shall not exceed the total quantity authorized.	
31	<u>4.</u>	While the documentation of a prescription or chart order shall be retained by the dispensing pharmacy as	
32		evidence of its lawful dispensing of the prescription drug, the person's lawful authority to obtain the drug	
33		conveyed by the prescription or chart order shall continue to exist until the earliest of the expiration date	
34		of the prescription or chart order, or in the alternative, when the total quantity authorized has been	
35		dispensed.	
36	<u>5.</u>	In the event a person requests a pharmacy to transfer an unfilled prescription for a medication not listed as	
37		<u>a controlled substance</u> to another pharmacy, the pharmacy shall comply with that request as soon as	
38		possible, but no later than the end of the next business day. In the event a person requests a pharmacy to	

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39			transfer the remainder of an unexpired prescription to another pharmacy, the pharmacy shall transfer that				
40			prescription information in compliance with the provisions of this Chapter as soon as possible but no later

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75	4	<u>a</u> . Upon the receipt of an oral prescription from an authorized prescriber, the pharmacist or pharmacy
76		intern or pharmacy technician shall reduce the order to a written form prior to dispensing the
77		medication. As an alternative to recording such prescriptions on paper forms, a pharmacist may enter
78		the prescription information directly into the pharmacy's dispensing information system.
79	<u>b</u>	. In the event a pharmacy intern or pharmacy technician transcribes such a prescription, the supervising

82	4	<u>a.</u> The prescription form shall be of a size not less than 4 inches by 5 inches, and shall bear a single

84	2	<u>b</u> . The prescription form shall clearly indicate the authorized prescriber's name, licensure designation,
85		address, telephone number, and if for a controlled substance, the Drug Enforcement Administration
86		(DEA) registration number. In the event that multiple practitioners are identified on the prescription
87		form, the authorizing prescriber's specific identity shall be clear and unambiguous. This
88		identification may be indicated by any means, including but not limited to, a marked check box next
89		to, or circling, the authorized prescriber's printed name.
90	3	c. No prescription form shall contain more than four active prescription drug orders. Each active
91		prescription drug order on the form shall provide the following:
92		a i. check box labeled "Dispense as Written", or "DAW", or both; and

94	4	d. The prescription shall be written with ink or indelible pencil, typewriter, or printed on a computer
95		printer and shall be manually signed by the practitioner on the date issued and in the same manner as
96		he would sign a check or legal document (e.g., J. H. Smith or John H. Smith). Examples of invalid
97		signatures include rubber stamps, signatures of anyone other than the prescriber, and computer-
98		generated signatures.

119	F.	Completion of Prescription Orders and Chart Orders. In the event a pharmacist receives a prescription order or
120		chart order lacking certain required information, the pharmacist may consult with the prescriber to clarify the
121		prescriber's intent. Following a consultation with the prescriber and the appropriate documentation thereof on
122		the order:
123		1. A pharmacist may add the following data elements on the order:
124		a. Patient's address; or
125		b. Drug dosage form.
126		2. A pharmacist may record changes in the following data elements on the order:
127		a. Patient's address;
128		b. Drug strength;
129		e. Quantity prescribed; or
130		d. Directions for use.
131		3. A pharmacist shall never add or make changes to the following data elements on the order:
132		a. Patient's name;
133		b. Date of issue;
134		c. Drug name (except for generic interchange as permitted by law); or

136		Prescription Adaptation
137		1. With the patient or caregiver's consent, a pharmacist may adapt a prescription drug order or chart order
138		unless the prescriber has indicated adaptation is not permitted, subject to the following limitations:
139		a. A pharmacist may change the quantity of medication prescribed if:
140		i. the prescribed quantity or package size is not commercially available;
141		ii. the change in quantity is related to a change in dosage form or therapeutic interchange;
142		iii. the change is intended to dispense up to the total amount authorized by the prescriber; or
143		iv. the change extends a maintenance drug for the limited quantity necessary to coordinate a
144		patient's refills in a medication synchronization program.
145		b. A pharmacist may change the dosage form of the medication prescribed if it is in the best interest of
146		patient care; however, the pharmacist shall modify the prescriber's directions to ensure an equivalent

147		amount of the medication prescribed is dispensed.			
148		c. A pharmacist may add information missing on the prescription drug order or chart order if there is			
149		evidence to support the change.			
150	2.	2. A pharmacist who adapts a prescription drug order or chart order shall document the adaptation in the			
151		patient's record.

160	A. Pre	scription Refills			
161	<u>1.</u>	Limitations on Number of Refills			
162		a. The refilling of a prescription for a drug listed in Schedule II is prohibited.			
163		b. A prescription for a drug listed in Schedule III or IV may be refilled up to five times if so indicated			
164		at the time issued.			
165	c. A prescription for a drug listed in Schedule V may be refilled without limitation if so indicated at the				
166		time issued subject to the one-year expiration date of the prescription.			
167		d. A prescription for a drug not listed as a controlled substance or for a medical device, medical gas, or			
168		durable medical equipment may be refilled without limitation if so indicated at the time issued			
169		subject to the one-year expiration date of the prescription.			
170	<u>2.</u>	Refill Authorization. Prescription refills may be dispensed only with the prescriber's authorization, as			
171		indicated on the original prescription order. In the absence of the authorized practitioner's instructions on			
172		the original prescription, the prescription shall be considered non-refillable. When all refills authorized			
173	•	on the original prescription have been dispensed, then authorization from the prescribing practitioner			
174		shall be obtained prior to dispensing; when such authorization has been received, a new prescription shall			
175		be prepared and it shall be issued a different prescription number.			
176	<u>3.</u>	Patient Request for Continuation of Therapy. When previously authorized refills have been dispensed, or			
177		when the previous prescription has expired, and the patient or caregiver requests continuation of therapy,			
178		the pharmacy shall submit a request to the prescriber for a new prescription. A pharmacy may offer their			
179		patient an auto-refill service to facilitate such requests. In the absence of a specific request for			
180		continuation of therapy from the patient or caregiver, the pharmacy shall not submit a request for			
181		continuation of therapy to a prescriber.			
182	B 4	. <u>Dispensing of Refills Requests</u> . Prescription refills authorized by the prescriber shall not be dispensed in			
183		the absence of a patient or caregiver's request or approval. This prohibition shall not apply to refills			

authorized by the prescriber which are to be dispensed to a patient residing in a long-term care facility.

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- 1. The refilling of a prescription for a drug listed in Schedule II is prohibited.
- 2. A prescription for a drug listed in Schedule III or IV may be refilled up to five times, if so indicated at the time issued.
- 3. A prescription for a drug listed in Schedule V may be refilled if so indicated at the time issued subject to the one year expiration date of the prescription.
- <u>DB</u>. Medication Synchronization and Refill Consolidation. These terms refer to a service which a pharmacist may perform for his patient, at the request of the patient, wherein he may proactively adjust the medication dispensing quantity and/or the refill schedule of a prescription in order to manage the patient's medication therapy, with the goal of improved medication adherence by the patient.
 - 1. For the performance of this service, the pharmacist may adjust the dispensing quantity and/or the refill schedule originally ordered by the prescriber; however, the pharmacist shall not exceed the total quantity prescribed [dispensing quantity multiplied by the total number of fills authorized (original plus refills)], or what is otherwise allowed by law.
 - 2. With respect to prescriptions for controlled substances where refills have been authorized, pharmacists may utilize partial fills, as described in Paragraph 2747.C.5 of this Part, but may not exceed the dispensing quantity noted on the original prescription.
