8 9	§2523. Transfer of Prescription Information
10	A. Prescription Transfer Requirements
11	1. Prescriptions for Controlled Dangerous Substances
12	a. The transfer of original prescription information for a controlled substance listed in Schedules III,
13	IV, or V for the purpose of refill dispensing is permissible between pharmacies on a one-time basis
14	only. However, pharmacies electronically sharing a real-time, on-line database may transfer up to
15	the maximum refills permitted by law and the prescriber's authorization, whether or not the
16	pharmacy from which the prescription is transferred is open for business. Transfers are subject to
17	the following requirements:
18	i. The transfer is communicated directly between two licensed pharmacists and the transferring
19	pharmacist records the following information:
20	(a) Invalidation of the prescription.
21	(b) Record on the reverse of the invalidated prescription the name, address, and DEA
22	registration of the pharmacy to which it was transferred and the name of the pharmacist
23	receiving the prescription information.
24	(c) Record the date of the transfer and the name of the pharmacist transferring the
25	information.
26	b. The pharmacist receiving the transferred prescription shall reduce to writing the following:
27	i. Indication of the transferred nature of the prescription.
28	ii. Provide all information required for a prescription for a controlled substance (full name and
29	address of patient; drug name, strength, and dosage form; quantity prescribed and directions for
30	use; and the name, address, and DEA registration of the prescriber) and include:
31	(a) date of issuance of original prescription;
32	(b) original number of refills authorized on original prescription;
33	(c) date of original dispensing;
34	(d) number of valid refills remaining and date(s) and location(s) of previous refill(s);
35	(e) pharmacy's name, address, DEA registration number and prescription number from which
36	the prescription information was transferred;
37	(f) name of pharmacist who transferred the prescription; and
38	(g) pharmacy's name, address, DEA registration number and prescription number from which

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39	the prescription was originally filled.
40	iii. The original and transferred prescription(s) shall be maintained for a period of two years from
41	the date of the last refill.
42	c. Pharmacies electronically accessing the same prescription record shall satisfy all information
43	requirements of a manual mode for prescription transferal.
44	2. Prescriptions for Drugs Other Than Controlled Dangerous Substances
45	a. The transfer of original prescription information for the purpose of refill dispensing is permissible
46	between pharmacies, subject to the following requirements:
47	i. Prescriptions may be transferred up to the maximum number of refills permitted by the
48	prescriber on the original prescription.
49	ii. The transferring pharmacist, intern, or certified technician shall record the information itemized
50	in Clause 1.a.i above, with the exception of the DEA registration numbers.
51	iii. The receiving pharmacist, intern, or certified technician shall record the information itemized in
52	Subparagraph 1.b above, with the exception of the DEA registration numbers.
53	b. The original and transferred prescription(s) shall be maintained for a period of two years from the
54	date of the last refill.
55	c. Pharmacies electronically accessing the same prescription record shall satisfy all information
56	requirements of a manual mode for prescription transferal.
57	B. Pharmacies Using Common Electronic Files
58	1. Pharmacies using a common electronic file are not required to physically or electronically transfer
59	prescriptions for information dispensing purposes between or among pharmacies participating in the same
60	common prescription file; provided, however any such common file must contain complete and adequate
61	records of such prescriptions, and further, that a hard copy of each prescription transferred or accessed for
62	purposes of refilling shall be generated and maintained at the pharmacy refilling the prescription or to
63	which the prescription is transferred.
64	2. This accommodation shall comply with all state and federal laws and regulations regarding controlled
65	dangerous substance prescription transfers.
