11	§1139. Definitions
12	A. As used in this Subchapter, the following terms shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this Section, unless
13	the context clearly indicates otherwise.
14	Centralized Prescription Dispensing - the fulfillment by one permitted pharmacy of a request from another
15	permitted pharmacy to fill or refill a prescription drug order.
16	On-Site Pharmacy - a permitted pharmacy which utilizes centralized prescription dispensing services from a remote
17	dispenser or remote processing services from a remote processor.
18	Remote Dispenser - a Louisiana permitted pharmacy which provides centralized prescription dispensing services for
19	another permitted pharmacy in Louisiana.
20	Remote Processing Services - the processing of a medical order or prescription drug order by one permitted
21	pharmacy on behalf of another permitted pharmacy, including:
22	a. receipt, interpretation, or clarification of an order;
23	b. data entry and information transfer;
24	c. interpretation of clinical data;
25	d. performance of drug utilization review; and
26	e. provision of drug information concerning a patient's drug therapy; provided, however, that remote
27	processing does not include the physical preparation or physical transfer of drugs.
28	Remote Processor - a Louisiana permitted pharmacy which provides remote processing services for another
29	permitted pharmacy in Louisiana.

35	§1141. Centralized Prescription Dispensing
36	A. General Requirements
37	1. An on-site pharmacy may obtain centralized prescription dispensing services from a remote dispenser
38	provided the pharmacies:
39	a. have the same owner or have entered into a written contract or agreement that outlines the services to
40	be provided and the responsibilities and accountabilities of each pharmacy in compliance with federal

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41	and state laws, rules, and regulations; and
42	b. share a common electronic file or have appropriate technology to allow access to sufficient
43	information necessary or required to provide the requested services.
44	2. All drugs dispensed to a patient that have been dispensed by a remote dispenser shall bear a label
45	containing an identifiable code that provides a complete audit trail of the dispensing of the drug and
46	pharmacy primary care activities.
47	B. Policies and Procedures
48	1. On-site pharmacies and remote dispensers engaging in the acquisition or provision of centralized
49	dispensing services shall maintain a policy and procedure manual for reference by all personnel; it shall be
50	made available for inspection and copying by the board.
51	2. At a minimum, the manual shall include policies for:
52	a. a description of how the parties will comply with federal and state laws and regulations;
53	b. the maintenance of appropriate records to identify the responsible pharmacist(s) in the dispensing and
54	counseling process;
55	c. the maintenance of a mechanism for tracking the prescription drug order during each step in the
56	dispensing process;
57	d. the maintenance of a mechanism to identify on the prescription label all pharmacies involved in the
58	dispensing of the prescription drug order; and
59	e. the provision of adequate security to protect the confidentiality and integrity of patient information and
60	to prevent its illegal use or disclosure.
