6	§1111. Pharmacist Absence
7	A. A pharmacist is considered absent from the prescription department when he is not in the prescription
8	department and is off-site.
9	B. When a pharmacist is absent from the prescription department, the prescription department must be securely
10	closed and made inaccessible. A sign shall be displayed in a conspicuous position in front of the prescription
11	department giving notice of closure. The sign shall be at least 8½ x 11 inches with the following wording in black
12	letters at least one inch high: PRESCRIPTION DEPARTMENT CLOSED.
13	C. During a state of emergency pursuant to the Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act of 1993, R.S. 29:721 et
14	seq., a state of public health emergency pursuant to the Louisiana Health Emergency Powers Act, R.S. 29:760 et
15	seq., or other situations approved by the Board, prescriptions prepared for delivery to the patient may be placed in a
16	secured area, adjoining the secured prescription department, where access to the prescriptions is restricted to
17	individuals designated by the pharmacist-in-charge. Prescriptions may be transferred to the patient when the
18	pharmacist is not on duty with the approval of the pharmacist-in-charge. The pharmacist-in-charge shall be
19	responsible for the implementation of policies and procedures to address the secured area which shall include but is
20	not limited to access, delivery to the patient, storage, patient confidentiality, record keeping, and counseling.
