33	A. Registration	
34	1. All pharmacy technician candidates shall obtain a registration from the	
35	professional functions in a pharmacy; failure to do so may result in disciplinary	action by the board.
36	2. Qualifications	
37	a. The applicant shall be at least 18 years of age, as evidenced by a val	id and legible copy of a birth
38	certificate or other appropriate credential.	
39	b. a. The applicant shall be of good moral character and non-impaired.	

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41	e. b. The applicant shall satisfy one of the following eligibility criteria: One of the three following eligibility	v
42	criteria shall be satisfied by the applicant:	-
43	i. proof Verification of enrollment in a nationally-accredited and board-approved pharmacy technician	
44	training program and at least 18 years of age, as evidenced by a valid and legible copy of a birth certificate or othe	
45	appropriate credential.; or	
46	- ii. Proof of successful completion of a board approved technician certification examination, and further	.,
47	proof of successful completion of a high school approved by a state department of education or an equivalent degr	ee
48	of education, as evidenced by a valid and legible copy of a diploma, transcript, or other appropriate credential.	
49	ii. Verification of enrollment in a Louisiana Department of Education program with a pharmacy	
50	technician career path and at least 16 years of age, as evidenced by a valid and legible copy of a birth certificate or	<u>r</u>
51	other appropriate credential. Applicants under 18 years of age shall provide evidence of an Employment Certificat	te
52	as required by the Louisiana Department of Labor.	
53	iii. Verification from a Louisiana licensed pharmacist, who is not on probation with the Board, indicating	g
54	their intention to provide technician training in a pharmacy that is not on probation with the Board. The applicant	_
55	shall be at least 18 years of age, as evidenced by a valid and legible copy of a birth certificate or other appropriate	
56	credential.	
57	d. <u>c.</u> Exceptions	
58	i. A pharmacist or pharmacist pharmacy intern whose board credential has been denied, suspended,	
59	revoked, or restricted for disciplinary reasons by any board of pharmacy shall not be a pharmacy technician	
60	candidate or pharmacy technician.	
61	ii. A Louisiana pharmacist or pharmacist pharmacy intern whose board credential is lapsed active shall	
62	not be a pharmacy technician candidate or pharmacy technician until such lapsed credential is recalled through no	n -
63	disciplinary board action relinquished.	
64	3. Issuance and Maintenance	
65	a. Upon receipt of a properly completed application, appropriate fee, and any other documentation requir	ed
66	by the board, the board may issue a Pharmacy Technician Candidate Registration to the applicant.	
67	b. The board reserves the right to refuse to issue, recall, or discipline a registration for cause.	
68	c. The registration shall expire 24 months after the date of issuance, and it shall not be renewable.	
69	d. Termination of Enrollment Training; Status of Registration	
70	i. In the event the candidate is no longer enrolled in a nationally accredited and board approved	
71	pharmacy technician training program training with the Pharmacy Technician Educator, for any reason other than	
72	graduation completion of the training, the candidate no longer meets the eligibility criteria to possess the	
73	registration, and the candidate shall relinquish the registration to the board within 10 days, giving notice of their la	ıst
74	day of enrollment in the program training.	
75	ii. In the event a candidate fails to relinquish their registration when required to do so, or when notified	
76	by the board office of that requirement, the board staff shall inactivate the registration. and refer the matter to the	
77	board for its consideration of disciplinary action against the candidate.	
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81	iii. In the event the candidate should re enroll in the original program or a different program resume
82	training with a pharmacy technician educator, and gives proof verification of that enrollment training is provided to
83	the board, the board may re-issue the registration with the original expiration date preserved.
84	iv. In its discretion, the board may grant an exception to the original expiration date or reinstate the
85	registration upon request by the candidate demonstrating unusual circumstances.
86	e. A pharmacy technician candidate shall notify the board, in writing, no later than 10 days following a
87	change of mailing address. The written notice shall include the candidate's name, registration number, and old and
88	new addresses.
89	f. A pharmacy technician candidate shall notify the board, in writing, no later than 10 days following a
90	change in location(s) of employment. The written notice shall include the candidate's name, registration number,
91	and <u>pharmacy</u> name, address, and permit numbers for old and new employers.
92	B. Training Programs Pharmacy Technician Educators
93	1. Pharmacy technician educators shall provide academic preparation including technical skills and
94	knowledge, sufficient to prepare the candidate to adequately perform the duties of a pharmacy technician. Academic
95	preparation shall meet the minimum requirements of a board-approved pharmacy technician certification
96	examination provider.
97	1.2. All <u>nationally-accredited</u> training programs approved by the board shall maintain their national
98	accreditation.
99	2.3. The training program Pharmacy technician educators shall notify the board within 10 days when a
100	pharmacy technician candidate is no longer enrolled in the program or actively progressing in training with the
101	Louisiana licensed pharmacist. Evidence of a program's failure to comply with this rule shall constitute sufficient
102	basis for the withdrawal of the board's approval for the program.
103	3. <u>4.</u> The training program Pharmacy technician educators shall provide an appropriate credential to
104	verification that the pharmacy technician candidate who has successfully completed the program, training. provided,
105	however, that such credential shall not be formatted in such a manner to lead anyone to believe that credential
106	resembles a document providing legal authority to practice as a pharmacy technician.
107	C. Practical Experience
108	1. The candidate shall possess a registration prior to performing any permitted professional function or
109	earning any practical experience in a pharmacy.
110	2. The candidate shall wear appropriate attire and be properly identified as to name and candidate status while
111	on duty in the prescription department.
112	3. A candidate shall not work in a permitted site that is on probation with the board, or with a pharmacist who
113	is on probation with the board.
114	4. The candidate's registration shall evidence his authority to earn practical experience in a pharmacy, under the
115	supervision of a pharmacist, in satisfaction of the requirements for pharmacy technician certification:
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120	a. in In the event the registration was issued to an applicant enrolled in a nationally-accredited and board-
121	approved training program, the candidate shall earn the amount of experience prescribed by the curriculum of that
122	program <u>.</u> , which may include hours earned in a consultant pharmacy practice which does not hold a pharmacy
123	permit; or
124	b. in In the event the registration was issued to an applicant by any other method, the candidate shall earn at
125	least 600 hours of practical experience in a pharmacy in Louisiana., provided however, that a <u>A</u> candidate may
126	receive board credit for a maximum of 50 hours per week, unless further limited by an Employment Certificate as
127	required by the Louisiana Department of Labor.
128	5. Hours of practical experience earned by a candidate shall expire two years after the expiration date of the
129	registration.
130	D. Examination
131	1. A board-approved pharmacy technician certification examination shall consist of integrated pharmacy
132	subject matter and any other disciplines the board may deem appropriate in order to permit the candidate to
133	demonstrate his competency. The candidate shall achieve a passing score, as determined by the board.
134	2. In the event the candidate fails the examination, the candidate may repeat the examination in compliance
135	with the test administrator's policy.

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142	§905. Pharmacy Technician Certificate
143	A. Qualifications
144	1. An applicant for a pharmacy technician certificate shall be at least 18 years of age, as evidenced by a valid
145	and legible copy of a birth certificate or other appropriate credential.
146	2. An applicant shall be of good moral character and non-impaired.
147	3. An applicant shall demonstrate one of the following educational competencies.
148	a. In the event the applicant obtained their technician candidate registration on the basis of their enrollment in
149	a nationally-accredited and board-approved pharmacy technician training program, the applicant shall demonstrate
150	successful completion of that training program, or in the alternative, another nationally-accredited and board-
151	approved pharmacy technician training program.
152	b. In the event the applicant obtained their technician candidate registration by any other method, the
153	applicant shall demonstrate the acquisition of at least 600 hours of practical experience under the supervision of a
154	pharmacist, using a form supplied by the board.

155	Regulatory Proposal 2024-A ~ Pharmacy Technicians Draft #3 (Coded Version) c. In the event the applicant has been licensed, registered, or otherwise credentialed by another state board of
156	pharmacy and has been practicing for at least one year as a pharmacy technician in that state, the applicant shall
157	demonstrate successful completion of a board-approved pharmacy technician certification examination.
158	4. An applicant shall demonstrate successful completion of a board-approved technician examination, as
159	evidenced by a valid and legible copy of the appropriate credential.
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162	B. Issuance and Maintenance
163	1. Upon receipt of a properly completed application, copies of valid and legible credentials, the appropriate fee,
164	and any other documentation required by the board, and following verification that all requirements have been
165	satisfied, the board may issue a pharmacy technician certificate to the applicant for the current renewal period.
166	2. The board reserves the right to refuse to issue, recall, or discipline a certificate for cause.
167	3. The annual renewal shall expire and become null and void on June 30 of each year.
168	a. The board shall make available, no later than May 1 of each year, and an application for renewal to all
169	pharmacy technicians to the address of record.
170	b. The completed application, along with the appropriate fee, shall be submitted to the board by June 30 of
171	each year.
172	c. A pharmacy technician shall not assist in the practice of pharmacy in Louisiana with an expired renewal.
173	d. An application for an expired pharmacy technician renewal, along with the appropriate fee, shall be
174	submitted to the board's reinstatement committee for consideration.
175	4. A pharmacy technician shall notify the board, in writing, no later than 10 days following a change of mailing
176	address. The written notice shall include the technician's name, certificate number, and old and new addresses.
177	5. A pharmacy technician shall notify the board, in writing, no later than 10 days following a change in
178	location(s) of employment. The written notice shall include the technician's name, certificate number, and <u>pharmacy</u>
179	name, address, and permit numbers for old and new employers.
180	6. Upon written request of any certified pharmacy technician in active military service of the United States or
181	any of its allies, the board may waive the requirement for the annual renewal of the certificate, including fees.
