6 Subchapter A. General Requirements

7 §1105. Pharmacist-in-Charge

8 A. The opportunity to accept an appointment as the pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) of a pharmacy is a professional
9 privilege. The following requirements are attached to a PIC privilege.

10 1. The acquisition of the PIC privilege shall require:

11 a. ...

12 b. active pharmacy practice for a minimum of ~~two years~~ one year under the jurisdiction of any board of
13 pharmacy in the United States; and

16 C. Authority and Accountability. The pharmacist-in-charge and the owner of the pharmacy permit shall be
17 ~~ultimately~~ responsible for the complete supervision, management, and compliance with all federal and state pharmacy
18 laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy of the entire prescription department. This responsibility
19 necessarily includes accountability for any violation involving federal or state laws or regulations occurring within
20 the prescription department supervised by a pharmacist-in-charge.
